

# **Sydney Light Rail**

**Fact Sheet: Construction schedule** 

## How has major construction been planned and what does it entail?

- The route has been divided into 31 zones, with work staggered to minimise the impact of construction on those who live, work or do business along the route.
- The scheduled major construction timeframe for each zone has been released, so residents and businesses can plan ahead.
- Outside those periods, work will continue on technical fit-out and platform construction, which will be more confined and less intrusive.
- Major construction includes excavation, rebuilding roads and laying tracks.

#### Preparation for the start of construction

- Transport for NSW has learned from the challenges confronted by light rail projects in Edinburgh and the Gold Coast, and we have undertaken an unprecedented level of investigations to establish the exact location of buried utilities along the 12-kilometre route.
- Working with utility owners such as Ausgrid, Sydney Water and Telstra, we have conducted more than 3,500 pit surveys and investigations, and dug more than 200 trenches along the route.
- Knowing the location of buried cables and pipes will reduce the risk of finding unexpected infrastructure beneath the surface during major construction, ensuring work is completed efficiently.

## Incentives to complete work early

- The contractor delivering the project, ALTRAC, will pay significant financial penalties if it spends longer than the allocated time in any zone and there are incentives to finish zones ahead of time.
- ALTRAC can alter its construction schedule (but not the duration within any individual zone), but must provide 60 business days' notice. The public will be advised well in advance of any changes to the published schedule.
- Early preparatory works involving night-time and weekend closures have taken place in each area to ensure major construction is completed quickly.

#### Key timelines and dates

• The busiest months for major construction will be August-November 2016 and May 2017, each of which will see activity in 17 work zones.

#### Key dates for major construction

- September 2015, construction access for Moore Park West Corridor
- October 2015, CBD works start
- January 2016, start of Randwick branch
- February 2016, start of Kingsford branch
- August 2016, start of work in Surry Hills
- September 2016, completion of the first pedestrian zone block in George St
- May 2017, completion of final pedestrian zone block in George St
- September 2017, start of the final work zone along the route (Elizabeth St to Chalmers St)
- September 2017, arrival of light rail vehicles
- April 2018, completion of major civil construction; ongoing works continue to finalise the installation of electronic systems and construction of platforms
- June 2018, testing commences
